LIU DI

born 1985 in Shanxi Province, lives and works in Beijing, China

Liu Di believes that "by violating the rules of common sense, we can break the hypnotic trance induced by familiar reality." Liu uses digitally manipulated photographs to investigate the friction between the natural world and urban residents in China.

His series "Animal Regulation" (2010) features a suite of exaggeratedly large and cartoon-like wild animals, like the giant rabbit in Animal Regulation No. 7, sitting in the midst of destroyed landscapes of residential neighbourhoods. He explains that these works look at a mutually destructive relationship through ruins of both human and animal living spaces. Liu first conceived of the project while navigating the crowded suburbs of Beijing, where he has been based since his graduation from the Central Academy of Fine Arts.

Liu Di has a powerful instinct to create images that a leave lasting impression on its viewers. Many of his influences come from literary works of science-fiction and these transform into an entirely novel universe with a remarkable philosophical subtext. Through his hypnotic imagery, Liu Di finds a way to tap into the unconscious to carry its viewers through a discourse of human existence and its future. He is a true futurist at heart; a meticulous observer of the history with a deep concern for today's tribulations. The aweinspiring images accommodate animals, giants, sceneries of rich vegetation, elaborate interior design elements and chaotic urbanisation. As an artist his is a very refined sentiment of care and fantasy. This vision sparks many questions about human and animal rights, urbanisation, ecology, and the overwhelming hegemony of technology. Liu Di inspires an uncanny sense of both hope and melancholy. His imagination is a fantastically intricate expression of humankind today and now.
