(aka No.223)

Naming himself after the police character in the movie Chungking Express, "No.223", Lin Zhipeng combines in his photos Wong Kar-Wai's movie poetic and dreamy atmosphere, resulting in mysterious and almost lonely characters. Lin usually frames erotic, often insolent and chaotic scenes, portraying his friends and models in a punk and rough way. Together with LGBTQ+ related themes, fruits and flowers often become the *fil rouge* in his works; symbol of playful sexuality, they hold a close connection with the subjects of Lin's portraits. Sex, as well as myriad patterns are mixed with an emotional ambiguity, making the viewer feel uneasy and intrigued all at once. No.223's images are saturated with a soft sense of carefreeness, yet at times melancholy, amidst a hedonist lifestyle going against the entrapments of expected social norms. His "simple, violent, and immediate" photographs proclaimed him a leading figure in the recent Chinese photography scene.

Born in Guangdong, China in 1979, Graduated from Guangdong University of Foreign Studies with major of financial English.

Created in 2003, his blog "North Latitude 23" received millions views and made him famous among the web community.
